BARNSLEY YBC'S WELCOME PACK

Barnsley Youth Bowling Club (YBC) is a junior league club that takes place on Saturday mornings throughout the year and offers coaching, tournaments and discounted bowling. Barnsley YBC is a sanctioned league; therefore, we will adhere to, and follow the rules set out by the BTBA (British Tenpin Bowling Association) and the YBE (Youth Bowling England)

BARNSLEY YBC's VISION:

Barnsley YBC is an inclusive club to all, and we would encourage any bowler from the of age 6-22 to join us. As a club we will respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person and we will treat everyone fairly and equally within the context of the sport regardless of age, ability / disability, gender, race, ethnicity, religious belief, sexuality / orientation, and social/economic status.

BARNSLEY YBC BOWLERS ARE TO:

- Arrive at 9:45 for registration and to pay their £9.50 registration fee
- Bowling will start at 10 am and finish at 1 pm (These times may vary due to any events or tournaments held therefore bowlers will be notified accordingley)
- * Barnsley YBC committee have the right to amend this charge in accordance with its running costs and the upkeep of the club. Notification will be provided to bowlers and parents in advance of any changes.

New bowlers who join the YBC will receive their first taster session **FREE**. After receiving the FREE session, the following weeks will be charged at £9.50 a week thereafter. New bowlers will need to be registered with the BTBA at the cost of £15 a year, and membership will be the parent's and bowlers' own responsibility to maintain yearly. Payment is asked from the 4th week bowled, and new bowlers will receive their BTBA membership card around 2 -3 weeks later.

- Medical History
- Two Codes of Conduct for Children, 1 for the bowler to keep and 1 for the YBC.

- The bowler information sheet will need to be filled in and returned ASAP, please.
- Both copies of the code of conduct will need to be signed with one copy kept with the pack for the bowler and the other returned to the YBC.
- The photograph permission slips grant the YBC permission to take your child's photo and use it in publications for the use of displaying their achievements. This could be in the in-house magazine or on the Facebook page etc.

- **5.** As a bowler you must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of age, gender, disability, race, cultural background, religious beliefs, sexual identity, and orientation.
- **6.** To keep to the agreed timings for training and competitions. Inform your coach or Secretary if you are going to arrive late.
- 7. To pay any fees for your league or events promptly to cause any delay.
- **8.** Mobile phones, earphones, and tablets will only be allowed during practice time, after that these devices will not be permitted on the lanes; these must be put away safely either in your bags or given to parents.
- **9.** Bad language, improper gestures or the abuse of any bowling equipment or machinery will not be tolerated by the club or within the bowl and will result in a suspension.
- **10.** These rules are expected to be followed within any bowling alley and when representing the club at any tournaments therefore, we always expect your best behaviour.
- **11.** If your behaviour is not to an acceptable standard or you are not deemed to be safe to be around other members then you will be asked to leave the lanes immediately.
- 12. Behaviour and foul language, You will receive 1 verbal warning, if continued you will receive a second verbal warning you will also run the risk of being told to leave your lane, your scores will be removed and will not be counted towards the league scores. If removed, unfortunately, you will not be able to participate in the rest of the league play for that day or any coaching. You will receive a 1-week ban due to being removed. The decision given/made will be authorised by the president upon information given by the coaches or officials.
- **13.** Any junior member is <u>NOT</u> permitted at <u>ANY TIME</u> to smoke/vape, drink alcohol, or take any prohibited/recreational drugs whilst representing the club, this includes any league tournaments/competitions that are sanctioned or unsanctioned.

DRESS CODE

- **14.** As a bowler you will be required to wear suitable bowling attire for training.
- **15.** The correct uniform must be worn during the league (unless stated) The uniform consists of the following: The approved Barnsley YBC shirt, black/grey tailored trousers/shorts, black leggings/skort.
- **16.** Any Barnsley YBC bowler that enters competitions/tournaments through the club will be required to wear the same as point **15**.
- **17.** Only the approved black YBC hoodies can worn at any time however, these cannot be worn whilst bowling in any sanctioned tournament.
- **18.** The wearing of any denim/combats will **NOT** be permitted for any YBC league play, or in any tournaments and competitions entered.
- 19. No headwear or garments will be permitted (other than those for religious purposes only)
- **20.** If you arrive at your league in the incorrect dress code, you will be reminded to come in the correct uniform for next time. If this happens for a second time, unfortunately, you will not be able to bowl and you will be asked not to bowl however you will have the option of returning home to change and to then continue the league upon your arrival.
- **21.** Any lost or damaged Barnsley YBC shirt will result in a new one having to be replaced at the cost to the bowler or parents cost of £35
- **22.** Whilst wearing your YBC shirt you are reminded that in doing so you are representing your YBC therefore, you are expected to adhere to all of the Code of Conduct.
- **23.** Any rule or violation of the code of conduct can and will result in disciplinary action being taken.
- 24. You must stay on your lanes and not leave unnecessarily.

SUBS: £1.50

Subs will need to be paid for if any bowling sessions are missed. No subs will be payable over the 3-week Christmas period and there will also be a further 2-week holiday grace which can be spread over the bowling season from September to September. (Notice must be given of any holidays/absences) However, if a bowler misses 4 consecutive weeks then their membership will be put on hold, but the 4 consecutive weeks missed will stay be payable upon return.

Nonpayment of fees could lead to your BTBA membership being suspended. Rule 115b of the BTBA league rules.
